

Did You Know?

ENVIRONMENT & THE ECONOMY

- 36% of business development officials say litter impacts their decision to locate to a community (Keep America Beautiful, 2009)
- The presence of litter in a community decreases
 property values by a little over 7%, according to
 the National Association of Home Builders' pricing
 model (Keep America Beautiful, 2009)
- Homes with larger trees can increase property values by 3-15% (Arbor Day Foundation)




HEALTH & SAFETY

- Studies have found that there are double the number of people stealing when litter and illegal graffitti are present (New Scientist 2008)
- A 10% increase in tree canopy has been associated with roughly 12% decrease in crime (Arbor Day Foundation)
- There is a 6-10 degree temperature
 decrease in neighborhoods with well shaded streets (U.S. Forest Service
 Center for Urban Forest Research)

We inspire and educate Georgians to take action every day to improve and beautify their community environments.




Our Vision

 population





Our Main Programs

Applications and registration for these opportunities are available to our network of affiliates as well as the general public.

Bring One FOR THE CHIPPER

This is KGBF's flagship program, and the largest Christmas tree recycling program in the nation. Affiliates who participate and register with us receive statewide event promotion, as well as social media and event resources. Registrants are also eligible to receive in-kind supplies from our state sponsors, including vegetable/flower seed packets and tree seedlings.






The Greatest AMERICAN CLEANUP


KAB's flagship program takes place from March through June for communities to engage in cleanup efforts, recycling drives, educational workshops, and beautification events. Affiliates and other groups who register with KGBF receive statewide event promotion and may be eligible for inkind supplies.

BRACE GRANT PROGRAM

Made possible by the Solid Waste Trust Fund, this opportunity allows applicants to develop project proposals that best support their community needs in relation to eliminating litter and illegal dumping. Applications open in the fall, and although KGBF prioritizes smaller communities that might not otherwise have the funds, larger communities are eligible and also encouraged to apply.



National Funding OPPORTUNITIES

In addition to KGBF's offerings, affiliates, nonprofit organizations, local governments, and other community groups in Georgia can apply for grants through Keep America Beautiful. These vary year to year, but examples include RETREET (planting trees in areas impacted by natural disasters), the Cigarette Litter Prevention Program, and Martin Luther King Neighborhood Grants.
